

Each year, SEAs **Adopt NIMAS** and SEAs & LEAs select to **Coordinate with the NIMAC**.

NIMAS/NIMAC Coordinator (NNC):


- named by SEA Sped Administrator
- collaborates with AT Programs,
- registered with the NIMAC,
- signed the NIMAC coordination agreement,
- signed the NIMAC Limitation of Use Agreement (LUA), and then
- identifies and registers Authorized Users (**AUs**) including national Accessible Media Producers (**AMPs**).



Textbook-adoption **SEAs, and LEAs** within open territory states, require publishers to submit NIMAS file sets to the NIMAC when contracting for the purchase of textbooks and related printed core materials.




Purchase Order or Contract



Publishers establish an account with the NIMAC then prepare and submit files to the repository. Copyright protection for the submission is provided by IDEA 2004 when publisher has print distribution rights for all of the content.


Publisher notified when files accepted or reason why they were not.

NIMAS File Set




Local Production Option: LEAs request permission to digitize products for students who require accessible instructional materials but do not qualify for a copyright exemption when accessible versions are not available for purchase.

Direct Delivery of Specialized Formats




Market Model Option: Publishers may wish to obtain the electronic rights for all content then produce or contract for the development of specialized formats for sale directly to K-12 schools. NOTE: In many cases these will be general education products that are accessible.



The National Instructional Materials Access Center (NIMAC) receives, validates, and catalogs NIMAS file sets.

NIMAS File Set




LEAs request and obtain specialized formats (braille, audio, large-print and digital text) for qualifying students with print disabilities.



Development of AIM



AMPs register with the NIMAC, sign a LUA and are contracted for the development of specialized formats by **AUs**.

AMPs that operate under the Chafee Amendment to Copyright Law may distribute specialized formats directly to qualified students with print disabilities. LEAs work directly with the AMPs to register qualified students.



Authorized Users (AU) that have been registered with the NIMAC by the NIMAS/NIMAC Coordinator sign and submit a Limitation of Use Agreement (**LUA**) and may then download NIMAS file sets from the NIMAC to enhance and convert them to specialized formats. **AUs** may also assign textbooks to Accessible Media Producers (**AMPs**) for conversion.

When **AMPs** have been named as Authorized Users by an SEA, LEA representatives may request specialized formats from AMPs that will trigger a download from the NIMAC to the AMP for conversion.
